PASTOR’S CORNER
Without me, you can do nothing” (Jn. 15:5).

Dear Eucharistic people. Peace be with you! The Eucharistic Heart is both loving and generous. Such is His love for you. He loves you with a tender and faithful love, with a merciful and redeeming love. There is nothing that He will not do for you, for you are His, and He has set His Heart upon you, His/Her son/daughter forever. So many souls make little or no progress in holiness that Jesus desires for them because they do not trust in His grace. They attempt to change themselves by making use of purely human means, and forget that He is all powerful, all merciful, and ready at all times to heal and sanctify those who entrust themselves with their weaknesses and sins, to His most loving Heart. He asks only that they give Him their imperfection and the burden of their sins, and allow Him to do for them what, of themselves, they are incapable of doing. Without Jesus of the Eucharist you can do nothing. Why is this word of His so often forgotten? It is a word of immense power for the healing and liberation of souls because, understood rightly , it obliges us to run to Him in every necessity of body, mind, or spirit, and to allow Him to our savior, our physician and our God. One who seeks union with Jesus of the Eucharist will find that union more surely, more safely, and more sweetly by going first to His Mother and by consecrating himself unreservedly and forever to her Immaculate Heart. A father carried the same old wallet for years. It was faded, cracked, and held together at the corners. One Father’s Day, his children surprised him with a brand new wallet.
