PASTOR’S CORNER
Devotion to the Eucharist

“Devotion to the Eucharist,” St. Pius X, the Pope of the Eucharist, said, “is the noblest of devotions, because it has God as its object. It is the most profitable for salvation, because it gives us the Authority of Grace. It is the sweetest, because the Lord is Sweetness itself.”
Devotion to the Blessed Mother, is a distinctive feature of Paradise. The Angels and Saints of heaven also practice them. “There is a school in heaven,” the mystic St. Gemma Galvani, use to say, and there one has only to learn how to love. The school is in the Cenacle. The teacher is Jesus. The subject taught is His Flesh and His Blood.”
The Eucharist is Love itself, identical with Jesus. Therefore, it is the Sacrament of Love, the Sacrament that overflows with charity. It indeed contains the the true, living Jesus—the God who “is Love (JN. 4:8) and Wo loved us “unto the end” (JN 13:1).
All expressions of love, even the highest and most profound, are verified in the Eucharist. Thus it is Love that is crucified , a Love that unites, a Love that adores, a Love that contemplates, a Love that prays, a Love that delightfully satisfies.
The Eucharistic Jesus is the Love that is crucified in the most Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, in which He renews the immolation of Himself for us. Let us never be cold, indifferent, irreverent, ungrateful, abandon and forsake Him in our tabernacles in our Churches. Amen!

The Owen Connolly Estate provides annual bursaries, worth approximately \$2,500, to Roman Catholic residents of PEI who can demonstrate their Irish heritage and have material financial need.
